PREFACE

On August 26, 1920, the Nineteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution providing for women to vote in federal and state elections was approved. In Pennsylvania, eight women were first elected to the House of Representatives of the 1923/24 term, followed by one woman in the Senate in the 1925/26 term of the Pennsylvania General Assembly. Since 1923, there have been 217 women Representatives and 30 Senators (thirteen of whom sat in the House first). The report is a study of those elected officials based on information derived chiefly from the online websites of the Pennsylvania General Assembly (www.legis.state.pa.us), the Historical Biographies of the Archives of the House of Representatives (<https://archives.house.state.pa.us/people/house-historical-biographies>), and the Historical Biographies of the Senate (<https://www.library.pasen.gov/people/historical-biographies>), the *Pennsylvania Manual*, and online websites like Wikipedia, Ballotpedia, and individual official's websites. Jeanne H. Schmedlen's *History of Women in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives 1923-2001* (2001) provided an outline on how to create this report. For more details, see Chapter 10, Bibliographical Essay.

CHAPTER 1. INTRODUCTION

The legislative branch of Pennsylvania government is the General Assembly. The Assembly dates back to the beginnings of colonial Pennsylvania in 1682. Throughout the colonial period, the Assembly was a single house. Under the Constitution of 1776, the General Assembly continued as a single house along with a Supreme Executive Council substituting for a governor. In the Constitutions of 1790, 1838, 1874, and 1968, the General Assembly consisted of two houses: Senate and House of Representatives. This report covers one hundred years from 1923/1924 to 2023/2024.

The addition of the Nineteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution in 1920 provided the path for women to vote in federal and state elections.¹ In November 1922, the first eight women were elected to the House of Representatives of the General Assembly as representatives from the county/city of Philadelphia: Alice M. Bentley, Rosa Stein de Young, Sarah M. Gallaher, Helen Grimes, Sarah Gertrude McKinney, Lillie H. Pitts, Martha G. Speiser, and Martha Gibbons Thomas. Pitts served the longest from 1923 to 1932.²

Flora Vare was the first woman elected in 1924 to the Senate to sit from 1925 to 1928 and was not followed until Jeanette Reibman in 1967.

For the one hundred years from the 1923/24 term to the 2023/24 term, 30 women sat in the Senate from 1925 and 217 in the House of Representatives from 1923. In the Senate, there was a large gap (1929-1976) with no women members. Women sat in the House for all years but for 1941-1944, ranging from one to sixty-six members. This report will provide some introduction to the women legislators who sat in each house, chronologically by year, by county, by political party, by age, by leadership position, and by minority representation followed by biographies of the individual members. A bibliographical essay provides sources for this work and for further research.

CHAPTER 2. CONSTITUTIONAL BACKGROUND

The Pennsylvania General Assembly is defined under the Constitutions of Pennsylvania. Under the Constitution of 1874, Article II defined the Legislature. The Assembly consisted of two houses, the Senate and House of Representatives (§ 1). The legislature was elected every two years to begin on December 1 (§ 2). The Assembly met in biennial meetings, beginning the first Tuesday of January every second year (§ 4). An amendment of November 3, 1959, made the sessions annually and the legislature to enact appropriations bills in even-numbered years.³ A second amendment of May 16, 1967, made the Assembly a continuing body for two years.⁴

Section 5 provided for senators to be 25 years old and representatives 21 years old, citizens and inhabitants of the state for four years, and inhabitants of the district for one year previous to the election, and reside in their districts during their term of service.

The state was divided into fifty Senatorial districts with fifty senators (§ 16). The House was “divided by the population of the State as ascertained by the most recent United States census by two hundred.” (§ 17).

Under the current Constitution of 1968, Article II, § 1 again established a two-house legislature of the Senate and House of Representatives. Section 2 provided for the election of members at a “general election every second year” with the term beginning the first day of December after the election. Section 3 provided for the legislature to meet at 12:00 p.m. the first Tuesday of January with special sessions called by the governor as needed. Section 5 contained the same age and residency requirements as the 1874 Constitution. By § 16 the Senate consisted of 50 members and the House of Representatives consisted of 203 members, “which shall be composed of compact and contiguous territory as nearly equal in population as practical.” By § 17 a Legislative Reapportionment Commission would meet after each decennial census and reapportion the Commonwealth and providing detail as to how it would function and its decisions reviewed.

Amending the Constitution requires a process cited in Article XVIII of the 1874 Constitution and Article XI of the 1968 Constitution. Amendments can only be added through legislative action (Pennsylvania does not have initiative and referendum as found in other states). Under the article, a constitutional provision has to be introduced as a joint resolution that has to pass by a majority vote in both houses of the legislature in two different General Assemblies. The provisions have to be advertised in public newspapers at least three months before a vote. The electorate has to have a majority vote in favor of the amendment to pass. Once it is passed the Governor signs a proclamation acknowledging its passage (the governor plays no role in the passage of the amendment). The resolutions and governors’ proclamations can be found in the official *Laws of Pennsylvania* published annually by the State.

General Assembly

For purposes of this report, the General Assembly met biennially in the odd-year from 1923 to 1959 with special sessions called for 1926, 1932, 1934, 1936, 1938, 1940, 1942, and 1944.⁵ From 1959 onwards, the Assembly met annually and then in two-year sessions following the adoption of the Constitution of 1968. I have counted each year as a session.

CHAPTER 3. LEGISLATORS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Senate

There have been 30 women members of the Senate, 15 Democrats and 15 Republicans. Members represent single or multiple counties. Thirteen senators sat in the House of Representatives before being elected to the Senate. Seventeen members sitting in the Senate were new to the Assembly. Since representatives cover more than one county, the number of counties is more than the number of representatives: five representatives from Philadelphia, three representatives from Allegheny, two from Butler, Erie, and Montgomery, and one from Armstrong, Clarion, Cumberland, Delaware, Forest, Lawrence, Lehigh, Monroe, Northampton, Venango, Warren, Washington, and York.

Senate members sat from 1925-28 and from 1967 to 2024. This breaks down to three senators sitting for six terms, two sitting for five and eight terms, and one each for one, two, four, seven, ten, and fourteen terms. Flora Vare was the earliest member who served from 1925 to 1928, with a long break until 1967 when Jeanette Reibman sat between 1967 to 1994. Senate leadership included Jeanette F. Reibman, who held the role of Minority and Majority Caucus Administrators; Mary Jo White who also served as a Majority Caucus Administrator; and Jane Clare Orie who served as Whip.

Years of Service by Members

Of the 30 members of the Senate and 217 of the House of Representatives, only thirteen members sat in both Houses. These members with their total number of service were:

Of the 67 counties, 35 counties had female senators and 32 did not. Since some members represent more than one county, 63 individuals are listed covering the 35 counties. Seven members sat for Montgomery, six for Philadelphia, four for Allegheny, three for Berks and Butler, two for 10 counties, and one for 20 counties.

House of Representatives

Of the 217 members, ten members had twenty years or more of service, and only one had thirty. Sixty-three members had between ten and nineteen years of service. 144 members had less than ten years of service. The large increase of women in the two Assemblies of 2021-2022 and 2023-2024 resulted in 32 members sitting for four years and 49 members sitting for two years. The five members with only one year were representatives elected to fill a term or resigned after one term in office.

Of the 217 members, service spanned from one year to thirty years.

CHAPTER 6. LEGISLATORS BY POLITICAL PARTY

There are 51 General Assemblies containing 102 sessions from 1923 to 2024. The Senate had fewer members than the House (as expected), and had the largest time span between memberships with no women sitting between 1929 and 1966. The House only missed four years during World War II when no members sat (1941-44).

Senate

There were 30 female members of the Senate. Flora Vare was the first senator to sit from 1925 to 1928. It took forty years until the next senator assumed office, Jeanette Reibman in 1969. She also served as the sole female senator in the longest term of 28 years (1969-1994). Of the 29 two-year sessions (1967 to 2024), only one in 2015-16 had a discrepancy of two members in 2015 and one member in 2016. 29 of 40 Assemblies had female members, the high of only seven in four Assemblies, six members in two Assemblies, five in three Assemblies, four in three Assemblies, two in three Assemblies and one session, and one in 13 Assemblies and one session.

House of Representatives

Forty Assemblies (80 sessions) had the same amount of members in both sessions. Ten Assemblies (20 sessions) had a different number of members (no more than two). The passage of the Nineteenth Amendment for women to vote led to the first elections in November 1922 with the first eight women elected to the 1923-24 Assembly; only six were elected to the next Assembly in 1925-26. The number of women continued under ten during the 1920s and 1930s, with a low of only two members from 1935 to 1940, while no women were elected to the two Assemblies covering 1941-1944. The numbers began to rise again in the 1950s from a low of five to 13 in the 1959-60 Assembly, but dipped and rose again in the 1960s and 1970s. Starting in 1987, the numbers began to rise from 15 members to mid-20s in the late 1990s. From 2001 to 2024, the numbers continued to increase dramatically into the 30-range in the first half of the 2010s, and into the 40s during the second half of the 2010s. In the 2020s, the number rose into the 50s and 60s. The highest number is 66 members in 2023 followed by 64 in 2024.

CHAPTER 7. LEGISLATORS BY AGE

The age of the senators and representatives are found chiefly in the historical biographies of the General Assembly website and searching with Google to obtain more biographical information, e.g., Wikipedia entries. For some individuals, birth dates/year are not available and the decade has been estimated by graduation date of high school or college.

Senators

Of the 30 senators, it is interesting that the birth year begins as early as the 1870s and the most recent in the 1980s. Fourteen were born in the 1950s and five in the 1960s. Flora Vare was born in 1873 and became the first senator in 1925. Melissa Hart, born in 1962, was the youngest female senator at age 29. Patricia Vance and Carolyn Comitta were the oldest senators at 68 and 69 years old, respectively.

House of Representatives

Of the 217 representatives, the earliest representatives elected in 1923 had the earliest birth-date year which began with Alice Bentley (1859), Sarah Gallaher (1864), Ella Louella Collier Adams (1865), and Martha Gibbons Thomas (1869). The latest three representatives were born in the early 1990s: Jessica Benham (1990), Stephanie Sciablabba (1991), and Dawn Keefer (1992). Four representatives did not have birth years, but based on when they graduated high school or college it was possible to assign them a decade. Three individuals have not been assigned to a decade

because of lack of information available (Melissa Cerrato, Lindsay Powell, and Mandy Steele) (all elected to the 2023-24 Assembly).

CHAPTER 8. LEADERSHIP POSITIONS IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Leadership positions in the Senate and House include the Speaker, Floor Leaders, Caucus Administrator, Caucus Chairman, Floor Chairman, and Whip (Whip, Assistant, Chief, Deputy). All are elected positions except for the Assistant Whip which is an appointed position.

Senate

In the Senate, only four women have served in leadership offices. Kim L. Ward served in the highest position as Senate Pro Tempore in the 2023-2024 Senate and was the Senate Floor Leader in 2021-22. Only two members—Jeanette F. Reibman and Mary Jo White—have served as Majority Caucus Administrator, while Joan Clare Orie served four years as Whip.

House of Representatives

In the House of Representatives, fifteen legislators have held various leadership positions within their parties. Of the fifteen members, there were seven Democrats (Tina Davis, Leanne Krueger, Jennifer Mann, Joanna McClinton, Marion Munley, Mary Varallo, and Rosita Youngblood) and eight Republicans (Sheryl Delozier, Mae Kernaghan, Sandra Major, Marian Markley, Donna Oberlander, Elinor Taylor, Marcy Toepel, and Martina White).

Of the following positions, Deputy Whips are appointed positions; all the others are elected. The database does not have a search for deputy whips and was found in looking at the selected women who have won higher positions within their party. Marian Markley was the first woman in a leadership position as Minority (Republican) Caucus Secretary (1959-62), followed by Marion Munley as Minority (Democrat) Caucus Secretary (1963-64). Mae Kernaghan served as the first Majority (Republican) Caucus Chairman (1967-68) and Mary Varallo served as first Minority (Democrat) Caucus Chairman (1957-58). Joanna McClinton is the first African-American woman Minority Floor Leader (2021-22) and then Speaker of the House (Feb. 23, 2023-2024).

CHAPTER 10. BIBLIOGRAPHICAL ESSAY

The constitutional aspects of the General Assembly can be found in Articles II and III of Constitutions of 1874 and 1968. The paper sources for the current 1968 Constitution can be found in Section 2 of the *Pennsylvania Manual* and *Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes* in an official, unannotated edition published by the Pennsylvania Legislative Reference Bureau. It can also be found on the General Assembly's website, at www.legis.state.pa.us under the Legislation Tab at the top the page and in the Pennsylvania Constitution Website at Duquesne University Thomas R. Kline School of Law, at www.paconstitution.org.

Annotated versions of the 1968 Constitution can be found in *Purdon's Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes Annotated*, the unofficial, annotated edition published by Thomson Reuters Company (formerly West Publishing Company) in print format or online in Westlaw and LexisNexis databases. The print version provides court cases arranged by West digest topics, encyclopedia references, ALR annotations, legal periodicals and newspapers, and treatises. Online databases provide similar information, but there are some differences between Westlaw and LexisNexis databases. In addition, there are two citators to access constitutional information. *Shepard's Pennsylvania Citations* (2014 ed.) provides in the Statutory Volumes a listing of the 1874 and 1968 Constitutions that the legal researcher can search individually (which the online Lexis version does not provide) and Westlaw's KeyCite to identify cases citing the Constitution.

There are only a handful of books on Pennsylvania constitutional law and history. Rosalind Branning's *Pennsylvania Constitutional Development* (1960)⁶ is the standard source for an introduction to Pennsylvania's constitutions of 1776, 1790, 1838, and 1874. Branning followed it up with an abridged version of her work in *History of Pennsylvania Constitutions*, Research Manual No. 3 prepared by the Preparatory Committee for the 1967 Pennsylvania limited constitutional convention.⁷ Professor Thomas Raeburn White, *Commentaries on the Constitution of Pennsylvania* (1907) is an older scholarly work, but still valuable as a description of each article/section of the 1874 Constitution. *Pennsylvania Constitutional Law* (1985) provides an incomplete discussion of the 1968 Pennsylvania Constitution. Unfortunately, there is no complete work covering the 1968 Constitution.⁸ Ken Gormley and Joy G. McNally, eds. *Pennsylvania Constitution: A Treatise on Rights and Liberties* (2d ed. 2020) deals only with Article I of the Pennsylvania Constitution. The *Pennsylvania Law Encyclopedia* (2d ed. Lexis) is available in print and online covering two volumes (10-11) on constitutional law. Individual titles on specific legal topics may also contain chapters on constitutional law. The PBA/PBI also offers CLE books on statutory drafting under various titles, e.g., *Legislative Update* or *Legislative Process in Pennsylvania*. These books are available in the academic and county law libraries.

Thomson Reuter (formerly West Publishing Company) provides *Vale Pennsylvania Digest* and *West's Pennsylvania Digest 2d* offering 450 categories including Constitutional Law for researching court cases from the United States Supreme Court down to the trial courts in Pennsylvania. These works are available in print and online. LexisNexis offers its own digest system as well, but only online.

First, the *Pennsylvania Manual* (formerly called *Smull's Legislative Hand Book*, 1876-1922) is the state-published book covering the makeup of the state government. It has been published biannually since 1923 under the current title. An electronic edition can be found under the Pennsylvania Department of General Services Website, at www.dgs.pa.gov/.

The book is divided into sections: 1. Pennsylvania Past and Present. 2. Constitution of Pennsylvania. 3. General Assembly. 4. Executive. 5. Judiciary. 6. Local Government. 7. Elections. 8. The Federal Government. 9. Appendix. [10]. Index.

Section 3 on the General Assembly section is broken down into multiple parts: the Senate, the House of Representatives, Statistics of Bills Presented by the Legislature, Legislative Service Agencies, Legislative Reference Bureau, Pennsylvania Legislative Correspondents' Association, and Past and Present. Under both houses, there is a list of officers and executive staff, biographies of all of the members, District Maps, Legislative Districts, Legislative Districts by County, Standing Committees, rules of each house, decisions of points of order, and index to decisions. The Past and Present section contains historical lists of members of the house and senate, of officers of both houses, Speakers of the House from 1682 to present, special sessions of the General Assembly since 1791, and lengths of legislative sessions since 1776.

For biographical information, each individual has a short paragraph summary in the *Pennsylvania Manual*. The *Pennsylvania Manual* contains listings of members of the House of Representatives Prior from 1776 to 1790 (88 *Pa. Manual* 503-08); 1790 to 1890 (88 *Pa. Manual* (104 *Pa. Manual* 519-77); 1890-1948 (88 *Pa. Manual* 578-621); 1874 to 1950 (104 *Pa. Manual* 288-315) from 1950 to 1974 (115 *Pa. Manual* 3- -3-); and from 1975 to 2024 (126 *Pa. Manual* 3-265-3-275). For the Senate, 1790-1890 (88 *Pa. Manual* 509-19); 1890-1948 (88 *Pa. Manual* 578-84), 1900-1978 (104 *Pa. Manual* 281-87) and from 1950 to 2024 (126 *Pa. Manual* 3-260-3-264).

The Pennsylvania General Assembly maintains its official website, www.legis.state.pa.us. The website provides tabs for General Assembly, senate, house, session info, legislation, statutes, and login. For purposes of this work, the Senate and House of Representatives tabs give you information on members of each house, committees and officers. On the lower left side, there is a link to Historical Biographies. The website lets you research by individual name, gender, position, served in year, district, and select county, party, and keywords. The links are for the Senate (<https://www.library.pasen.gov/people/historical-biographies>) and for the House (<https://archives.house.state.pa.us/people/house-historical-biographies>). The members of the current Senate are not available in the Historical Biographies section, but available under the general website under the Senate tab and click on Members of the Senate to obtain the members from 2007-2008 Assembly to the present. The senators can be listed alphabetically by name or by district number, available at <https://www.palegis.us/senate/members>.

For the women legislators in the House of Representatives, Carol Blake wrote a short paper *Women in the Pennsylvania Legislature (1922-1982)* (1983?), followed by two longer works. There are two biographical dictionaries/directories: Jeanne H. Schmedlen, *History of Women in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives 1923-2001: the Suffrage Movement, Biographies, History of Statewide Women's Organizations and the Demographics of the 105 Women Who Have been Elected to Serve in the State House of Representatives* (2001). Each member has an extended biography compared to the biography found in the *Pennsylvania Manual*. An updated version is the *History of Women of the Pennsylvania House of Representatives, 1923-*

2020 (2020) can be found online at the Archives of the Pennsylvania House of Representatives, <https://archives.house.state.pa.us/download.cfm?file=Resources/newsletters/HistoryOfWomenInPAHouse.pdf>, published on the 100th anniversary of the Nineteenth Amendment.

The House of Representatives has an Archives of the Pennsylvania House of Representatives that contains biographical dictionary of the historical House members from which most of this report is drawn from. In addition, the Archive has a page devoted to *Historical Highlights of Women of the House*, <https://archives.house.state.pa.us/download.cfm?file=Resources/highlights/HistoricalHighlightsWomen.pdf> and *Historical Highlights of the Speakers of the House*, <https://archives.house.state.pa.us/download.cfm?file=Resources/highlights/Speakers.pdf>.

In addition, there is an online publication, *The Wilkes University Elections Statistics Project*, Dr. Harold E. Cox, Director, <https://staffweb.wilkes.edu/harold.cox/index.html>, containing Pennsylvania Election Statistics, 1682 to 2006. The site is divided into the Pennsylvania Colonial Assembly (Unicameral), 1682-1775, Pennsylvania General Assembly (Unicameral), 1776-1790, and Pennsylvania General Assembly (Bicameral). There are indexes to Members of the Senate (1789-1869), Representatives (1790-2004), and chronologically by session containing members, districts, and party affiliations from 1790-2004.

Another useful database is Ballotpedia, www.ballotpedia.com. There are descriptions of the Pennsylvania Senate and House of Representatives, plus one can search individual legislators to obtain biographical information and the results of the elections.

Wikipedia (www.wikipedia.com) contains descriptions of the Pennsylvania Senate and House of Representatives. The website also contains biographical information on individual legislators including all of the current 2023-2024 legislature.

Individual and prospective legislators also offer their own websites during election season to win over their constituencies.

Two studies on the legislature are John J. Kennedy, *The Contemporary Pennsylvania Legislature* (1999) and Sidney West, *The Legislative Process in Pennsylvania* (2d ed. 1984).

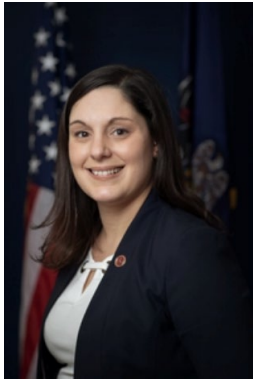

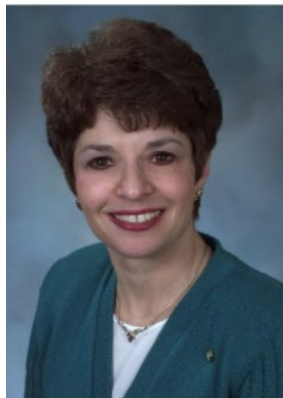
